ISA WAS BESTOWED TWO AWARDS AT THE ANDESCO CONGRESS

ISA was awarded the **2011 ANDESCO prize for its Corporate Social Responsibility**, praising its social performance and corporate governance, within the XIII National Congress, and IV International of Public Utility Services and TIC (Technology of Information and Communications) which took place in Medellin between June 22 and 24. This prize, audited by PricewaterhouseCoopers, has the endorsement of the United Nations Global Pact, to which ISA adhered to in 2005.

The Company presented its achievements in areas such as labor environment, market environment, environmental performance, social performance and corporate governance.

ISA introduced at this event its major project in social performance: **Education Transformation for Life**. This is a program that looks to design and develop a comprehensive process to support the educational institutions by surrounding the infrastructure (family, managers and the administrative community). This permits the transfer of those essential tools that contribute to the improvement of the quality of education from the perspective of sustainability. This is done in an effort to contribute to the improvement in the quality of life and wellbeing of the young, their families and all the members of the educational communities. For this reason, obtaining this award extols the work being done by ISA with respect to its contribution to the improvement of the quality of education, human rights and development.
